• KS2 LEAVING THE CLASSROOM UNACCOMPANIED: In September, with parental consent, our current year 2's will have the option to leave the classroom unaccompanied at the end of the school day. This may mean simply meeting their grown up by the school gate or a siblings classroom, walking just down the road to meet at the car or walking all the way home! Below is a useful tool/guide to help you make a decision about whether or not it is safe for your child to leave the classroom/school premises unaccompanied.



KS2 WALKING HOME UNACCOMPANIED

In order to ensure children's safety, only children in Key Stage 2 are allowed to walk home on their own. Children in Key Stage 1 need to be collected by an adult (it is not appropriate for an older sibling in KS2 to walk them home).

This does not mean that all children in KS2 are ready to walk home on their own. Parents need to consider their child's age, maturity and independence, as well as their distance from the school and the safety of the route before making a decision about whether or not it is safe for each child to walk home unaccompanied by an adult.

HELPFULTIPS FOR ASSESSING YOUR CHILD'S READINESS

How do you know if your child is ready to walk or ride his/her bike to and from school? By discussing possible scenarios with him/her. Ideally, your child should know the following twelve points before she/he is ever alone in public. Talk about each one of the twelve points listed below from Gavin de Becker's book, Protecting the Gift to help establish their readiness or areas to support them with:

- Does your child know how to honour his feelings? If someone makes him uncomfortable, that's an important signal.
- 2 Are you as the parent strong enough to hear about any experience your child has had, no matter how unpleasant?
- 3 Does your child know it's okay to rebuff and defy adults?
- 4 Does your child know it's okay to be assertive?
- 5 Does your child know how to ask for assistance or help?
- 6 Does your child know how to choose who to ask?
- 7 Does your child know how to describe the situation he finds himself in?
- B Does your child know it's okay to strike, even to injure, someone if he believes he is in danger, and that you'll support any action he takes as a result of feeling uncomfortable or afraid?
- 9 Does your child know it's okay to make noise, to scream, to yell, to run?
- Does your child know that if someone ever tries to force him to go somewhere, what he screams should include. "This is not my father/mother"?
- Onlookers seeing a child scream or even struggle are likely to assume the adult is a parent.
- Does your child know that if someone says, "Don't yell", the thing to do is yell? The corollary is if someone says, "Don't tell", the thing to do is tell.
- Does your child know to fully resist ever going anywhere out of public view with someone he doesn't know, and particularly to resist going anywhere with someone who tries to persuade him?

CELEBRATING WHITEKNIGHTS

A MESSAGE FROM OUR HEAD TEACHER

We are now at the end of another busy year and I would like to thank our whole school community – pupils, parents, staff and governors for all your hard work and dedication to ensure that all of our children are provided with excellence in education. We are in the top 1% of schools in the country, and as a headteacher I am extremely proud of everyone involved especially our wonderful pupils.



We have much to celebrate this year from an academic point of view: Our EYFS Good level of Development was at 90%, nationally schools attain 65% - this is the highest outcome for over 6 years — our Phonic Screening results – 98% passed the test – national average (most schools) outcomes are 79%; our year 4 multiplication test - 97% pupils achieved 23 out of 25 with 68% attaining full marks. Our SATS results were also very good.

I took over as headteacher in January 2024 and I have a vision that will not only continue to sustain our high academic expectations but also enhance and enrich the educational opportunities that our pupils will receive from next academic year and beyond. The staff and I have been working over past two terms to ensure that my vision becomes a reality.

Plans for next year:

To continue to sustain the high levels of academic excellence in Reading, Writing and Maths

We regularly review our teaching cycles in the core subjects and ensure that we are up to date with the most credible research in pedagogy. All of our staff meetings are dedicated to ensuring that staff are kept up to date with the most recent research along with reviewing and updating our teaching cycles so that we can ensure the best outcomes for our pupils.

Learning how to play musical instruments

From year 1 every pupil will learn a different instrument each year:

Year 1 – bell plates and boom whackers

Year 2 – Recorders

Year 3 – Xylophone Year 4 – Ukulele

Year 5 - Recorders including bass recorders – ensembles

Year 6 – Keyboard

By the time your children leave Whiteknights, they would have been taught 6 different instruments and will be able to read music which we hope will give them the inspiration to try other instruments and build their musical ability.

Computing

We have bought enough laptops this year, so that next year there will be enough for one between two pupils with my vision being that within 2 years every pupil will have a device to work on. The importance of upskilling pupils in computing is paramount as 92% of the careers in 2024 are digitally based. At present, the government are quoting that by 2030, 20% of the workforce will not be skilled enough to meet the digital demands. We will be planning in more opportunities in the foundation subjects to use computing in an effective way so that pupils can - not only build knowledge and cultural capital – but have the computer skills needed to access the secondary school curriculum and beyond.

The Knighthood Scheme

Traditionally The Knighthood Scheme was for year 6 only however my vision is to roll this out across the school. The Knighthood Scheme is linked to our PSHE scheme called Connect and it is a positive citizenship programme that allows pupils to not only think about how they fit into society but also how they can support others in our school community and at home. There will be tasks that the pupils need to complete some in school and some at home in order to achieve the various stages of becoming a Knight by the time they leave year 6. There are two other awards that they will need to achieve before being Knighted in year 6: by end of year 2 they will be awarded the *Page* status and by the end of year 4, pupils will be awarded the Squire status. Watch this space for more information.... The Knighthood Scheme will be up and running in

January 2025.

I hope that everyone has an enjoyable summer break and I look forward to seeing you and your children on September 3^{rd} ready for another exciting year.
