

If your child is unwell and unable to attend school, you are now able to log same-day absences using the Arbor app.

To record an absence, click on the *Quick Actions* button (≡) at the bottom left hand corner in your app, and then click *Attendance*. From there, click the green *Log Absence* button.


Please ensure you provide a reason for the absence, including any symptoms your child is experiencing. Once the absence is logged in Arbor, school will approve or reject the absence. Approved absences will appear in the Attendance tab of your Arbor App. School will follow up all absences that are rejected.

Create a British Science Week poster



The theme for 2025 is 'Change and adapt, – there are loads of STEM topics to be explored. For example, you could create a poster showing how plants and animals adapt to changing seasons or surroundings or how humans have adapted to changing technology. Technology changes all the time – how is it changing lives? Is it always for the better? You could look at climate change and how we can adapt our behaviours to protect the environment or your favourite science experiment and how it shows change. What about how you have changed and adapted to new experiences and places as you have grown? Do the stars and planets in space change? The more creative the interpretation of the theme, the better!



Paper (A4 or A3)

Creative materials such as:

pens, pencils, scissors, glue, watercolours, paint, crayons, pipe cleaners, felt, thread, wool, foil, clay, string, beads, stamps, foam, pompoms

Make your poster

Once they've done their thinking, it's time for children to get creative! Posters must be A4 or A3 in size and you'll need to be able to take a photograph of each one so it can be sent to us online for judging. Children can use pop-up pictures, pull out tabs or use materials such as pencils, paints, crayons and paper to create their posters.

How will the posters be judged?

We wish that everyone could be a winner, but we only have a limited number of prizes. So, here's the lowdown on what the judges at British Science Week will be looking for:

- Creativity in approach Innovative angle on the content or creative interpretation of the theme – don't be afraid to think outside the box
- Content Clear, accurate and informative about a STEM topic
- Effective communication presented and communicated in an engaging way. Member of the British Science Museum Association will shortlist entries, and a panel of judges will select a winner in each

category. The two runners up in each category will be uploaded to our Facebook page and the public will decide on a 'popular vote' winner.

What are the prizes?

Prizes for the 2024 competition winners included:

Cool Cat Chem Cards, 5-minute STEM books, Shape Aliens Game, At the museum jigsaw, A Day in the Life . . . Books, Shroot pouches, Memberships for My Science Clubs, MegaWatt Games, SuperQuesters: The Case of the Angry Sea STEM adventure books by QuestFriendz, A collection of Science Works Books, Two space-themed 3D building playsets, Our Living Planet Book, WWF adoption pack, Annual subscription to Save My Exams, A 12 month subscription to Alfresco learning.

Prizes may vary by age and category and by availability and we reserve the right to make changes to the prizes.

Guardian Consultations – April 2nd and April 3rd 2025 – in the School Hall

Bookings for December's Guardian Consultations will go 'live' on Arbor From 0700 on 04.03.2025 and closes at 1200 on 27.03.2025.

Once the bookings have closed on Arbor, you will need to contact the class teacher directly. The school office will forward any email requests but cannot make any adjustments without the class teacher's involvement.

We will continue to hold the 10-minute consultations in the school hall. Space will be sufficient for teaching staff and guardians; however, we do request that pupils and siblings are not brought to the consultations. This is not just a matter of space, more that consultations between guardians and teachers lead to a more focused and elevated conversation about your child and their progress.

As always, if you have a concern or a query about your child, you do not need to wait until the consultation to raise it. You are always welcome to contact the school office who will arrange a meeting with yourself and the class teacher separate to the consultation. Equally, if your 10-minute consultation raises the need for further conversation, you can contact the school office to arrange a follow up meeting.



Where does it all go?

All Grade A clothes consist of being 100% wearable, in good shape and colour with no marks or stains and these will be sent to shops just like the second-hand shops we have in the UK. We supply shops in Russia, Ukraine, Poland, Lithuania, The Czech Republic and many more countries where they will be resold to help those struggling communities.

All Grade B clothing and school wear would go further afield to our partners in Africa, Ghana, Cameroon and The Ivory Coast and may be over-washed, slightly misshapen or have small marks on. Any bedding that is donated also gets a second lease of life by being used as dust sheets for painting garages and shops or cut up for rags in car washes – so a massive 85% gets a second use.

Closer to home and here in the UK, all new underwear including new socks are given to our charity partner, Hands On London, whose volunteers distribute these to our vulnerable homeless people on the streets of London. Similarly, any sleeping bags are donated to our homeless charities and we have recently donated a generous supply to The Spitalfields Crypt Trust.

We quite often receive new balls of knitting wool which we pass on to our ladies at The Samaritans who in turn pass on, free of charge, to other knitting enthusiasts who make soft toys for children and donate them to paediatric hospitals and children's charities; nothing is wasted.
