NOTICES & RENINDERS If your child is unwell and unable to attend school, you are now able to log same-day absences using the Arbor app. To record an absence, click on the Quick Actions button (≡) at the bottom left hand corner in your app, and then click Attendance. From there, click the green Log Absence button. Please ensure you provide a reason for the absence, including any symptoms your child is experiencing. Once the absence is logged in Arbor, school will approve or reject the absence. Approved absences will appear in the Attendance tab of your Arbor App. School will follow up all absences that are rejected. AMENDMENTS TO END OF DAY ARRANGEMENTS:

If there are changes to end of day arrangements e.g. different adult picking up children, these need to be communicated to the school office by 14:30 at the very latest. We cannot guarantee that messages received after this time will reach the teacher.

NON PRESCRIBED MEDICATION IN SCHOOL:

For emergencies only situations, the school office may administer non-prescription medication provided that verbal consent (this includes Arbor consents) has been obtained in advance. The medications we hold in school are: Calpol Infant 2+ month; Calpol SixPlus 6+ years; Nurofen for Children 3 months—12 years; Piriton 1+ years; Nivea Kids Sensitive 50+ Sun Cream.

UPPER KS2 AND SMART DEVICES AT SCHOOL:

Mobile phones, and all smart devices with similar technology to mobile phones, will need to be handed to the class teacher at the start of the school day and will not be accessed again until the end of the day. It is our duty to create a safe and calm environment free from distraction so all pupils can receive the education they deserve. Please note that pupils bringing in a smart device will need to complete Mobile Phone Agreement which may be obtained from the school office or the website.

KS2 LEAVING THE CLASSROOM UNACCOMPANIED:

With parental consent through ARBOR, our Year 3's will have the option to leave the classroom unaccompanied at the end of the school day. This may mean simply meeting their grown up by the school gate or a siblings classroom, walking just down the road to meet at the car or walking all the way home! Below is a useful guide to help you make a decision about whether or not it is safe for your child to leave the classroom/school premises unaccompanied.

WALKING HOME UNACCOMPANIED GUIDE

In order to ensure children's safety, only children in Key Stage 2 are allowed to walk home on their own. Children in Key Stage 1 need to be collected by an adult (it is not appropriate for an older sibling in KS2 to walk them home).

This does not mean that all children in KS2 are ready to walk home on their own. Parents need to consider their child's age, maturity and independence, as well as their distance from the school and the safety of the route before making a decision about whether or not it is safe for each child to walk home unaccompanied by an adult.

HELPFUL TIPS FOR ASSESSING YOUR CHILD'S READINESS

How do you know if your child is ready to walk or ride his/her bike to and from school? By discussing possible scenarios with him/her. Ideally, your child should know the following twelve points before she/he is ever alone in public. Talk about each one of the twelve points listed below from Gavin de Becker's book, Protecting the Gift to help establish their readiness or areas to support them with:

- 1 Does your child know how to honour his feelings? If someone makes him uncomfortable, that's an important signal.
- Are you as the parent strong enough to hear about any experience your child has had, no matter how 2
- Does your child know it's okay to rebuff and defy adults? 3
- Does your child know it's okay to be assertive?
- 5 Does your child know how to ask for assistance or help?
- Does your child know how to choose who to ask? 6
- 7 Does your child know how to describe the situation he finds himself in?

- B Does your child know it's okay to strike, even to injure, someone if he believes he is in danger, and that you'll support any action he takes as a result of feeling uncomfortable or afraid?
- 9 Does your child know it's okay to make noise, to scream, to yell, to run?
- Does your child know that if someone ever tries to force him to go somewhere, what he screams should include, "This is not my father/mother"?
 - Onlookers seeing a child scream or even struggle are likely to assume the adult is a parent.
- Does your child know that if someone says, "Don't yell",' the thing to do is yell? The corollary is if someone says, "Don't tell",' the thing to do is tell.
- Does your child know to fully resist ever going anywhere out of public view with someone he doesn't know, and particularly to resist going anywhere with someone who tries to persuade him?

ARBOR: YOUR NEW BOOKING & PAYMENT SYSTEM

We are now using Arbor for:

As with ScoPay, you must have money in your Arbor account before making bookings. Families using Childcare Vouchers can continue as before.

ARBOR—CONSENT FOR USE OF IMAGES (PHOTOGRAPHS, VIDEOS, AND DIGITAL IMAGES) OF YOUR CHILD

As part of a summer revision of policies across all trust schools, BPET have updated consent forms for taking images of your child. Whiteknights and Bellevue Place Education Trust, of which Whiteknights is a part of, use images of pupils for two main reasons: as a learning tool for the pupils, and to publicly celebrate the achievements of the schools and its pupils.

Images can be displayed on the school or BPET's websites, social media, in (e)newsletters and printed publications, on the school's learning platforms, in physical displays and

press. Images are not routinely published and renewed consent will be sought if a press opportunity arises.

To comply with the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) we need your consent to take images of your child and use them in the ways described below:

School and BPET

Permission for your child's image or video to be used in the school's/BPET's newsletters, website, learning platforms and school display boards. Occasionally these may include social media (for example: while on a school trip or residential visit).

Local press

Permission for your child's image or video to be used in <u>occasional press releases</u> for local press. Renewed consent will be sought if the press opportunity requires naming your child (for example: if your child wins a prize, raises money for a cause).

These permissions will be shared via email with a link to action your consents on Arbor and will need to be completed by ALL FAMILIES, new and existing. All past image consents will now be null and void.

END OF TERM TIMES CHANGE:

In line with BPET expectations, we have amended the end-of-term finish times. Previously, the school day ended at 1:00pm; this will now be 3:20pm, the same as a normal school day.

Please note that, as before, there will be no after-school clubs or extended care on the last day of term.
