






WHAT IS PUPIL PREMIUM?

The Government provides funds to schools to help children from families with lower income, or in challenging situations. This funding is called Pupil Premium.

Pupil Premium is additional to main school funding; evidence suggests that this is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantaged pupils reaches the children who need it the most.

Schools decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility. Schools are held accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support children from disadvantaged families.

WPS - PUPIL PREMIUM STRATEGY 2025-2026

For 2025-2026, Whiteknights Primary School will receive £115,440 to support disadvantaged pupils. We spend our finances on initiatives which give pupils the best possible chance to make good progress at school. The money is supporting booster classes, before and after school clubs, school visits (including residential trips), swimming, holiday activities for vulnerable families and ensuring that Learning Support Assistants (LSAs) are on hand in every class to support learning. We review our strategy for using the pupil premium funding at the beginning of each academic year.


We encourage families to apply as this funding provides long-term benefits for the school and can support your child's education throughout their primary years.




